




Advice for pre-vet students?

Article of the Month

As temperatures rise, external parasites such as fleas, ticks, and mites become more active, posing significant risks to pets. These pests can cause severe itching, skin infections, anemia, and even transmit dangerous diseases. Fleas multiply rapidly, infesting both pets and their surroundings, while ticks—found in grassy or wooded areas—can spread illnesses like Lyme disease and must be removed with care. Ear mites, common in young cats, lead to intense scratching and secondary infections. Mange mites (sarcoptic and demodectic) primarily affect dogs, causing severe skin irritation and hair loss. Effective prevention, prompt treatment, and veterinary guidance are essential to control infestations and safeguard all household pets.




