

Article of the Month

This article explores the factors contributing to a Salmonella Agona (S. Agona) outbreak in a rottweller breeding facility linked with the consumption of an unlicensed raw-meat-based diet. In this case, researchers observed that the first dogs to show symptoms were the females shortly following parturition. Afterwards, the disease spread to their puppies and the other dogs in the facility, suggesting the physical stress involved in parturition may play a role in disease expression. Clinical signs of the disease included vomiting, diarrhea, lethargy, abdominal distention, whimpering, and decreased appetite, among others. Outbreaks of S. Agona pose a potential zoonotic risk, as this pathogen has also been associated with foodborne illness in humans and has a very low infectious dose to cause disease. Through antimicrobial therapy, all dogs in this case made a full recovery and none of them became carriers of the pathogen. The researchers highlight the importance of proper food handling and storage, feed traceability and supplier certifications when feeding a raw-meat based diet, and recommend educating pet owners about the potential risks associated with these products.




